Russia recently tested a powerful array of nuclear weapons which their highly emotive leader, Vladimir Putin, claims are invulnerable to ground-to-air missile defence systems of DNLEY FR \$72 \ V P 86 C HGR EPEV \$ batteries useless. Speaking in the annual state of the nation address, Mr Putin said the weapons included a nuclear-powered cruise missile, a nuclear-powered underwater drone and new hypersonic missiles that have no equivalent anywhere else in the world.

He said the nuclear-powered cruise missile tested last autumn had a "practically XQOLPLWHG´ UDQJH DQG KL manoeuvrability, allowing it to pierce any missile defence. The Russian leader said the high-speed underwater drone also had an <sup>3</sup>LQWHUFRQWLQHQWDO´ UDQJH carrying a nuclear warhead that could target both aircraft carriers and coastal facilities. +HVDLGLW¶VRSHUDWLRQDO meant that it was immune to interception.
